### Conservation Technician III/IV Forest Health

Trinity County Resource Conservation District is accepting applications for the position of Conservation Technician III-IV. The Conservation Technician III-IV will be a member on a Forest Health crew and be under the supervision of the Project Coordinator and the Program Manager and may perform a variety of natural resources related tasks. This position requires a person who can work effectively in a collaborative environment, is self-directed, is comfortable working independently, and can motivate themselves and a crew to maintain a high level of work quality, efficiency, and professionalism. The Conservation Technician III-IV is a full time, seasonal, fully benefited position running approximately April through November. It is a great opportunity to gain field experience and work with a range of partners. The candidate list generated from this announcement will be used to fill future vacancies in this job classification.

### **Required Qualifications:**

- Ability to lead or participate on a crew to consistently perform tasks to the level of quality and quantity expected
- 2. Ability to perform hard physical labor in rugged terrain, in inclement weather, and in very smoky conditions
- 3. Ability to work independently or as a team to complete natural resource related tasks
- 4. Ability to always maintain a high level of safety for yourself and others
- 5. Ability to communicate effectively and problem solve
- 6. Flexibility to assist with a variety of tasks to support District needs
- 7. Ability to lift 50 lbs
- 8. Possession of a valid California Driver's License
- 9. Ability to pass a drug test/screening and physical

### **Desired Qualifications:**

Preference will be given to candidates with the following skills and experience:

- 1. Experience working with the operation of common forestry equipment for natural resource management activities, such clinometer, relaskop, compass
- 2. Experience collecting data with a GPS (Garmin, Avenza, Trimble etc)
- 3. Ability to drive a 4x4 truck in inclement weather on poor road conditions
- 4. Knowledge of general forestry concepts; academic coursework in forestry or related subjects
- 5. Plant identification skills and familiarity with the local flora
- 6. Wildland Firefighting experience/qualifications
- 7. Knowledge of first aid and emergency response protocols
- 8. Ability to maintain a positive attitude and to navigate socially difficult situations9. Ability to camp for up to 4 days when excess drive time warrants

## **Duties:**

The Conservation Technician III-IV will perform a wide variety of natural resources related work, including but not limited to:

- Operation of various forestry equipment for data collection.
- Forest project unit layout
- Timber cruising, stand exams and other plot data.
- Complete all required crew documentation such as mileage logs, crew reports, safety meetings, and crew evaluations
- Photo documentation of work as needed
- Work with District and federal partners to develop work plans
- Communicate with landowners to develop private parcel treatment plans
- Participate in prescribed fire (Pile burning and broadcast burning)
- Work independently to achieve District and Partner goals
- Other related tasks as directed
