



The Bureau of Land Management is planning to hire 100 Interns age 16 and older for summer employment in 2024. Interns that successfully complete the program are eligible for non-competitive conversion to permanent or term positions within the federal government.

Trainee opportunities are available in civil engineering; public affairs; archaeology; outdoor recreation; environmental protection; natural resources; realty; contracting; and budget.

To be eligible, students must be currently enrolled and seeking a degree, diploma or certificate from an accredited high school, technical or vocational school, 2-year or 4-year college or university, graduate or professional school, on a full- or half-time basis.

An Internship Application Workshop will be offered at 4:00 p.m. Thursday, December 7th, at Treasure Valley Community College in the CTE Building, Room #107.

BLM staff will walk candidates through the usajobs.gov/ application process and be available to assist them with resume building.
