The Position

The Fremont-Winema National Forest is seeking one qualified individual to fill a permanent, fulltime position as Lead Forestry Technician in Timber Sale Preparation. If you are interested in applying for this challenging opportunity, please complete the outreach response form below, and attach a statement of interest.

This position serves as a forestry technician who will lead a small crew in timber sale layout, timber cruising, timber marking, and traversing sale areas using GPS devices. Work also includes assessing roads and terrain to determine logging feasibility, and drafting timber cruise plans and sale area maps. This position is zoned across the west side of the Fremont-Winema National Forest. The zone includes the Klamath, Chiloquin, and Chemult Ranger Districts. The duty station will be either Chiloquin or Chemult, OR.

Fremont-Winema National Forest Information:

The Fremont-Winema National Forest is located in Southern Oregon. Administratively combined from the 2002 merger of the Fremont and Winema National Forests, the Fremont-Winema National Forest offers 2.3 million acres to explore!

Forest Headquarters is located in Lakeview, Oregon and shares the Lakeview Interagency Office with the Bureau of Land Management's Lakeview District. There are seven Ranger Districts on the Forest. Four of them, located in Lakeview, Bly, Paisley, and Silver Lake, are on the former Fremont National Forest. The other three located in Klamath Falls, Chiloquin, and Chemult, are on the former Winema National Forest. There are also two interagency fire centers, one in Lakeview and one in Klamath Falls.

More than 300 species of fish and wildlife can be found in the area. Game animals most often hunted include mule deer, Rocky Mountain elk, and pronghorn antelope. Several varieties of trout inhabit lakes and streams, and a few lakes support warm-water fish, such as large-mouth bass and perch. Populations of some of the larger predators (black bear, cougar, gray wolf, coyote, and bobcat) and a great variety of nongame species can also be found.

The Oregon-California border marks the Forest's southern boundary, while its eastern boundary includes part of the Warner Mountain Range. To the north and west, the Forest is bounded by the Deschutes, Rogue River-Siskiyou, and Umpqua National Forests. Four wilderness areas can be found across this Forest: Mountain Lakes, Sky Lakes, Mount Thielsen, and Gearhart Mountain.

Other Vicinity Information:

The Klamath Basin is well-known for open water and marsh habitats, provided by the Upper Klamath Lake and Klamath Basin National Wildlife Refuge complex, and by refuges along the border of Oregon and California. These habitats host about 80 percent of the migrating waterfowl that use the Pacific Flyway. The Basin also supports the largest concentration of wintering Bald Eagles in the lower 48 states. And Crater Lake National Park is only about 35 miles from Chiloquin.
