The Boise National Forest is looking for a qualified candidates for multiple locations in conjunction with the national Society of American foresters (SAF) hiring event from **October** 24th to November 1st, 2023. These positions will have duty locations in Boise, Mountain Home, Idaho City, Lowman, Cascade, and Emmett. Various vacancies across the forest exist in Timber Stand Improvement (or Silviculture) and Timber Sale Preparation. Information on specific vacancies or job duties will be provided on request. BOISE NATIONAL FOREST

The Boise National Forest encompasses approximately 2.3 million acres across five ranger districts. Elevations vary greatly, from 2,800 feet in the North Fork Payette River Canyon to nearly 10,000 feet atop Steel Mountain. This wide range of elevations encompasses a great diversity of geologic features. Geologically the Forest is dominated by granitic rock, with inclusions of basalts to the west, and volcanic rock to the south. Major mountain ranges include the Boise, Salmon River and West Mountain ranges. The Forest has one of the largest timber and silviculture programs in Region 4. Approximately 76 percent of the Forest's lands are considered forested and about 23 percent are considered non-forested or dominated by grass, forb, shrub, or brush species.
